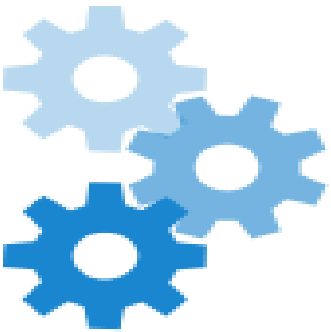

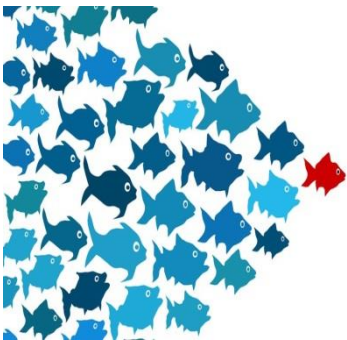

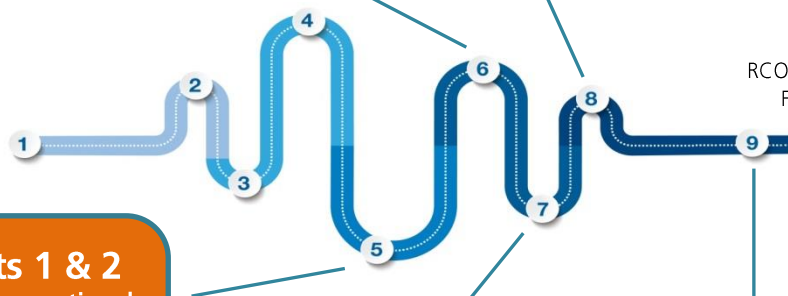
- 1991 Newly qualified occupational therapist
